- Do not coach or referee from the sidelines.
- Be positive. Applaud good plays by all players.
- Demonstrate a positive attitude toward your opponents and their families. Refrain from criticizing your child or any child's performance.
- Do not criticize your child's coach. If you are having issues, please speak to him or her at an appropriate time.

Falls City Soccer Club is promoting the game of soccer. We want your child to have a positive experience and create lasting memories. While winning is important, playing fairly, showing good sportsmanship, and being a good teammate are key. Your child's soccer career is a long term development process. FCSC is creating an environment for every child to grow at their own pace. Your support in everything FCSC does, goes a long way in helping us and you achieve our combined goals.

PARENT SPORTSMANSHIP AGREEMENT

- 1. I will support and encourage my child and their teammates.
- 2. I will respect and support my child's coach.
- 3. I will respect the referees and refrain from criticizing their calls.
- 4. I will let the coach do the coaching.
- 5. I will respect the 24-hour cooling off period before communicating with my coach.
- 6. I will be a good sport and teach my child good sportsmanship toward the opposing team and parents.
- 7. I understand the soccer has rules, and FCSC has policies, and guidelines they adhere to. All decisions made by the club are made in good faith and for the betterment of all players.
- 8. I will accept the consequences if I behave improperly. Consequences may include being removed from games by the referee, suspension from attending games, and removal from the team and the club.

If a parent is ejected from a KPL, KSSL, or KASL league game and the club is billed a fine for this infraction, FCSC will pass this fine along to the parent.
